- 2. What name is given to members of SNCC and others who attempted to integrate bus seating in the South? Freedom Riders
- 3. ***Who invented the Super Soaker and what was his other place of employment? Lonnie Johnson; NASA (National Aeronautics Space Administration)
- 4. **Who is the only African American in the U.S. Congress from Louisiana and who previously held that position? Troy Carter, Cedric Richmond
- 5. Who assisted Malcolm X in the writing of his autobiography? Alex Haley
- 6. Southern University and Grambling meet each November in what historical football game? Bayou Classic
- 7. ****Who were the Southern 16 and what happened to their case? They were arrested for conducting a sit-in demonstration in downtown Baton Rouge in 1960; They won their case at the Supreme Court
- 8. ***What was the Plessy vs. Ferguson case about? Homer Plessy was arrested for sitting in a "Whites only" section on a train in Louisiana. The case went to the Supreme Court in 1896. The court ruled against Plessy and thus legalized segregation.

- 10. ***In what year did Southern University open and in what city was the university founded? New Orleans, 1881
- 11. ***Who was the lead actor in the movie "The Black Panther", and in what mythical country did it take place? Chadwick Boseman, Wakanda
- 12. **Who played Jackie Robinson in the movie of his life, and what was Jackie Robinson's historical significance? Chadwick Boseman; Robinson was the first African American player to play major league baseball.

- 12. What is the significance of the 15th constitutional amendment? No one can be denied the right to vote because of race, color, or previous conditions of servitude.
- 13. How were African Americans kept from voting in spite of the 15th Amendment? Violence, fear of losing jobs, unfair literacy tests, poll tax, unconstitutional grandfather clause.
