




## **BOOTS & BLING** 25 AFFAIR 200






## NIGHT WITH THE STARS

The goal of the organization is to increase student access to marketable work experiences, career, and educational opportunities.



## Cooperative Extension Program Receives Grant to Fund Its JAGratory: Youth S.T.E.A.M Mobile Lab

The Southern University Ag Center's Cooperative Extension Program received funding via a competitive USDA/NIFA Capacity Building Grant to develop a Youth S.T.E.A.M. Mobile Lab entitled the JAGratory.

The JAGratory Science, Technology, Engineering, Agriculture, and Mathematics (S.T.E.A.M.) lab will provide youth with developmental programming and introduce youth to the vast technological world of agriculture. In addition to S.T.E.A.M programming, the interactive mobile lab and classroom will also provide broadband access to those youth in rural underserved communities who are unable to access Wi-Fi or internet services. Moreover, because of the mobility of the S.T.E.A.M lab, current staff can travel with the lab to provide expanded programming without the limitation of requiring a brick-and-mortar structure, thus enhancing access, and exposing youth to more experiential learning activities. Features of the JAGratory S.T.E.A.M Mobile Lab will include living laboratories, hydroponic systems, aquaponic systems, computer stations with ag tech and greenspace software for digital ag design training, immersive education via virtual and augmented reality programs for precision agriculture, exterior video screens/ projectors for class-like presentations, and an external drone hub to introduce new technologies in agriculture.

Dr. De'Shoin A. York, Vice Chancellor for Extension and Outreach will serve as the Program Director for the mobile lab. Co-directors are Dr. Raquel Ayles, Dr. Charity Schaffer, Dr. Ajayi Anwansedo, and William Augustine.

# SU Ag Center Delegation Visits CEGFSD Projects in Kenya

"Creating Opportunities for Louisiana Citizens Abroad"

The Center of Excellence for Global Food Security and Defense (CEGFSD) is one of six centers of excellence at 1890 universities identified in the U.S. Agriculture Improvement Act of 2018. commonly known as the 2018 Farm Bill. The Center is supported with funds from the United States Department of Agriculture's (USDA) National Institute of Food and Agriculture (NIFA). Through a competitive process, USDA/NIFA awarded CEGFSD grants to the University of Maryland Eastern Shore (UMES), the host institution, that implements the CEGFSD in collaboration with all nineteen 1890 universities. The CEGFSD builds on the work previously initiated by the Center of Excellence for International Engagement and Development (CEIED), which was one of three Anniversary Centers of Excellence established by the USDA/1890 Taskforce to commemorate the 125th Anniversary of the signing of the Second Morrill Act of 1890.

The Center mainly focuses on projects designed to enhance the supply of a globally educated workforce and addresses essential needs that would enhance global food security and defense in the cluster regions. The CEGFSD project in the East/Southern Africa Cluster focuses on four

thematic areas: (i) Value Chain research; (ii) Emerging technologies for the management of pests and diseases; (iii) Climate-Smart Agriculture; and (iv) Advancing global education through building the capacity for international research collaboration and student exchange programs, which are in line with the 2018-24 SU Ag Center Strategic Plan.

The Center strives to (i) foster international partnerships aimed at strengthening agricultural development in developing countries; (ii) engage with international researchers in addressing new and emerging animal and plant pests and diseases; (iii) engage in-country stakeholders in agricultural disaster recovery; and continuing with the activities previously carried out by the CEIED. The current CEGFSD project is titled: "Strengthening Learning, Discovery, and Engagement in Global Food Security and Defense in East/Southern



Africa through a Regional Cluster of 1890 Universities." It focuses on two countries: Kenya and the Democratic Republic of Congo. Overall, the current CEGFSD project aims to advance the long-term prosperity of the U.S. through global food security and defense initiatives.

The Southern University Agricultural Research and Extension Center (SUAREC or SU Ag Center) is part of the 1890 Universities participating in the CEGFSD project through the East/Southern Africa Cluster. To this effect, Drs. James Obuya, Research Assistant Professor of Plant Sciences and Lead CEGFSD project at the SU Ag Center and Devaiah Kambiranda, Professor of Plant Sciences, recently visited three (3) CEGFSD project sites in Kenya: Murang'a, Embu, and Chuka Counties - political administrative regions in Kenya from January 20-29, 2024. Kenya is an important growing market for U.S. agricultural and food products. The country has a huge deficit for rice, which creates new agribusiness opportunities for Louisiana, one of the three top rice-producing states in the United States.

The Murang'a County project is led by the Kenya Agricultural Livestock Research Organization – KALRO (www.kalro.org) and Kenyatta University (https://www.ku.ac.ke). The project focused on the "Enhancement of Global Food Supply Chains: East Africa Region as a Case Study." This project looked at the Banana Value Chain in Murang'a County. On Monday, January 22, 2024, Drs. Obuya and Kambiranda had a fruitful meeting with faculty members and graduate students at Kenyatta University.

This was followed by a meeting with CEGFSD partners at KALRO – a public research organization.





On Tuesday, January 23, 2024, Obuya and Kambiranda visited two banana value chain projects supported by CEGFSD.

On January 24, 2024, the researchers met with the Deputy Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs, the Dean of the College of Agriculture, faculty members, and students in the College of Agriculture.

On January 25, 2024, Obuya and Kambiranda visited two farmers in Embu County. Most of these smallholder farmers practice mixed farming such as crop and animal husbandry. Therefore, it was easy to look at the challenges of new and emerging animal and crop pests and diseases in each location.



The Chuka County project is led by the University of Embu (https://www.chuka.ac.ke). The project focused on the "Enhancement of Agricultural Productivity in the East Africa Region." On January 26, 2024, we had a meeting with the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Henry Mutembei, the Dean of the Faculty of Agriculture, faculty members, and students in the Faculty of Agriculture.
